Digital Convergence in San Francisco

If our story on an All Digital World has intrigued you, check out the **Digital Media Outlook** conference on September 12–13 at the San Francisco Airport Marriott. The conference, sponsored by Technologic Partners, features talks by the CEOs of many companies that are key players in the digital revolution, including Brøderbund, C-Cube, Crystal Dynamics, IIT, MicroUnity, Rocket Science, Spectrum Holobyte, 3DO, and Xing. These industry leaders will examine which digital media will prosper, whether the computer or the TV will be the gateway to the information superhighway, what technologies will be used for video on demand, and similar issues.

PowerPC Hits the Books

Morgan Kaufmann Publishers has a new set of books on PowerPC. *The PowerPC Architecture: A Specification* (ISBN 1-55860-316-6) is the first commercially available version of IBM's own architecture documentation. It is the official source for PowerPC information and covers the user instruction set, virtual environment, and operating environment architectures. A second book, covering IBM's RS/6000 and Prep (PC) system architectures, is due in the fall.

Shlomo Weiss and James E. Smith take a more tutorial approach in *POWER and PowerPC: Principles, Architecture, and Implementation* (ISBN 1-55860-279-8). This book describes the evolution of the PowerPC architecture and explains the reasoning behind various design decisions.

Embedded Systems in Silicon Valley
