Now that the mad scramble to deliver a 1GHz processor is over (see MPR 3/13/00-02, "AMD Wins Race to 1GHz by Hair"), Intel is resuming normal product-roadmap rollouts. The company has announced the availability of 850- and 866MHz Pentium III speed grades to backfill the gaping hole in its product line between 800MHz and 1GHz. The 850MHz part delivers a SPECint2000 performance of 356 and a SPECfp2000 performance of 240 (using the 440BX chip set). The 866MHz version with the 820 chip set boosts integer performance by almost 6%, to 374, and floating-point performance by nearly 11%, to 266. Both new speed grades are available now in either SECC2 modules or

Socket 370 flip-chip PGAs. List price in 1,000-unit quantities is \$765 for the 850 and \$776 for the 866. —*K.D.*

♦ GIGAPIXEL BOUGHT BY 3DFX

On March 27, 3dfx announced it will acquire GigaPixel Corp. in a stock-for-stock trade valued at about \$186 million. The company will use GigaPixel's 3D technology in future graphics chips for the PC and consumer-electronics markets. GigaPixel recently lost out to NVIDIA on the Microsoft X-Box project (see *MPR 4/3/00-01*, "Microsoft Weighs In With X-Box"). GigaPixel CEO George Haber will join 3dfx's board of directors. —*P.N.G*
